
TOMÁS MANUELES GÓMEZ

ABOUT THE PRODUCER

Tomás is a coffee producer born in 1978 in the village of El Zanate, San Sebastián, Lempira, and has around ten years producing coffee full time.

His beginning in coffee was not an easy one, as he comes from a very poor family that was able to send him to school for the first time until he was eight years old, and with many efforts, Tomas completed his basic studies by graduating of sixth grade at fourteen.

After he finished his studies, his father decided to move to San Marcos de Ocotepeque with hopes of improve their lives and get better jobs.

Tomás worked there as a day-laborer cleaning coffee farms, making nurseries, fertilizing and picking coffee during the harvest seasons. While doing all of this, he always told himself that one day, and with the help of God, he would become a coffee producer as well, even though the dream seemed very far away at the moment, but his desire of being able to acquire a small land kept him working very hard.

At the age of 20, he met his wife María Isidra and time later they started to grow their family, having six children in total. At the same time, Tomás also learned to grow potatoes, cabbage and other vegetables, which helped him to provide more food to his family.

Today, he still lives in El Zanate, and is looking forward to keep learning and producing more coffee. He's hopeful that the future crops help him achieve his news goals which are the improvement of his house and to be able to buy a vehicle for the first time in his life.
